The Festival of Nine Lessons and Carols is a worship service celebrating the birth of Jesus by recounting the fall of man, the promise of the Messiah, and the birth of Jesus through nine short Bible readings, interspersed with the singing of Christmas carols and hymns. The format was based on an Order drawn up by E.W. Benson, later Archbishop of Canterbury, for Christmas Eve 1880. The most famous version is broadcast annually from King's College, Cambridge on Christmas Eve featuring carols by the famous Choir.

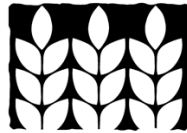
